#### **Good Thursday Morning to You!**

Welcome to an extra edition of the mailbag where you will find some of the comments, questions and ideas sent recently by subscribers of this newsletter or our publications. They are edited for space and clarity.

"Shane, I enjoyed reading your column about the use of the nonmetric system in the U.S., and I wanted to share part of my experience (Metric system, <u>June 6, 2023</u>). I started working in equipment manufacturing at John Deere Des Moines Works in 1968. Beginning in 1973, John Deere's CEO announced that John Deere Company would begin the transition to the metric system. Eventually, as new Deere equipment was designed and manufactured in U.S. and Canada, it would use only the metric system of measurements.

system of measurements. In 1978, all John Deere employees were given 16 hours of teaching/training on the how the metric system would be used in our manufacturing processes. The United States' national effort was halted in 1982, but that didn't stop global manufacturers and many other industries from continuing to use the metric systems. Medicine dosages for humans and animals use metric volumes or weight. Most water and soda bottles are 1/2 liter but are marked 16.9 ounces in the U.S. Wine is sold worldwide in 750 ml or 1.5 L, and if you want to go big, you can buy a 3.0 L jug or box. Every farmer, mechanic or do-it-yourselfer must have two complete sets of wrenches and sockets, standard and metric. The first vehicle I owned with heads-up display on the inside of the windshield was a 2003 Buick. It could be switched to display your speed in either miles or kilometers per hour. I had a lot of fun with the backseat



drivers' reaction to the display showing me driving 100 km/h in a 60 mph zone. Water freezes at 0 and boils at 100.

How can it get simpler than that? It would just take some patient mental processing to get it in perspective, just as we have historically done with the imperial system. Students today must learn both systems if they plan on a career in most professions. So maybe in another 50 years, the argument against the metric system won't include the cost to switch because we will be equipped with the necessary knowledge and tools to do both." - Merle

You are probably right, Merle, and I appreciate the examples of how things have changed. Even so, I am sticking with the imperial system. - Shane

"Hi, Shane! I always like to read your thoughts. And we have similar things on our minds this week! I started using subtitles while watching films in French (Subtitles, June 8, 2023). As a French instructor, I wouldn't advise my students to do this because it's important that they focus on more than the words and immerse themself in the experience. I'm the exception to my own rule because I am bilingual, and I can already understand the dialogue. But I'm to a level where there are teeny, tiny grammar things I am needing to double down on memorizing, and there are new words that pop up that I'd like to commit to memory by seeing how they are spelled and hearing them in context. Once the subtitles are on, they stay on. Recently I realized I was binging 'Pretty Little Liars' with them on. It bothered me that I wasn't looking at the characters, so I turned them off. But then I wouldn't understand what someone was saying, so I turned them on again. I kind of loathe this compulsion, and it sent me into a deep-thinking frenzy!" - Belle

#### On June 22 in history ...

**1944. FDR signs G.I. Bill.** On June 22, 1944, U.S. President Franklin D. Roosevelt signs the G.I. Bill, an unprecedented act of legislation designed to compensate returning members of the armed services—known as G.I.s—for their efforts in World War II.

As the last of its sweeping New Deal reforms, Roosevelt's administration created the G.I. Bill (officially the Servicemen's Readjustment Act of 1944) hoping to avoid a relapse into the Great Depression after the war ended. FDR particularly wanted to prevent a repeat of the Bonus March of 1932, when 20,000 unemployed veterans and their families flocked in protest to Washington. The American Legion, a veteran's organization, successfully fought for many of the provisions included in the bill, which gave returning servicemen access to unemployment compensation, low-interest home and business loans, and most importantly—funding for education.
