

# On June 23 in history ...

**1972. Title IX enacted.** On June 23, 1972, Title IX of the education amendments of 1972 is enacted into law. Title IX prohibits federally funded educational

institutions from discriminating against students or employees based on sex. It begins: "No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." As a result of Title IX, any school that receives any federal money from the elementary to university level—in short, nearly all schools—must provide fair and equal treatment of the sexes in all areas, including athletics.

## Valley Disaster Relief

#### Tree removal for those in need

When Hurricane Katrina hit in 2005, volunteers from Valley Church and other churches helped with the cleanup.

Upon their return, they realized there were many opportunities to help people locally. Valley Disaster Relief (VDR) was established and now focuses on helping central Iowans in need.

The faith-based organization responds to assistance with local disasters, storm cleanup and emerald ash borer tree removal. The service is for those who can't afford the cost of removing trees, limbs or storm debris. They also partner with Habitat for Humanity and various church camp tree removals.

In 2022, VDR completed 226 projects, which took 2,962 hours of volunteer work, and removed 240 tons of wood.
