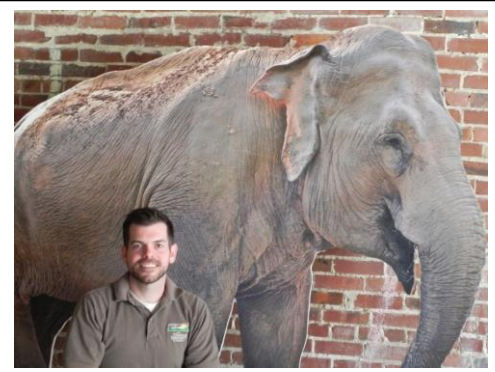
Our Program Today:

The Elephant Sanctuary in Tennessee was founded in 1995 to provide captive elephants with individualized care, the companionship of a herd, and the opportunity to live out their lives in a safe haven dedicated to their well-being, and to educate the public of the complex needs of herds of elephants in captivity and the crisis facing elephants in the wild.

Todd Montgomery is the Volunteer and Outreach Manager of The Elephant Sanctuary in Tennessee. He oversees The Sanctuary's Volunteer Day programs, Alternative Service Experiences, and the community-based volunteer programs. He has a degree in Anthropology from the University of Arkansas. Todd has worked for the elephants since January of 2013. He lives in Hohenwald, Tenn.

About our Four Way Test ...

One of the most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics in the world is the Rotary Four-Way Test.

It was created by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor in 1932 when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. Taylor looked for a way to save the struggling company mired in depression-caused financial difficulties. He drew up a 24-word code of ethics for all employees to follow in their business and professional lives.

The Four-Way Test was adopted by Rotary in 1943 and has been translated into more than 100 languages and published in thousands of ways.

It is repeated each week by members of the Fayetteville Rotary Club as they get their meeting underway.
