PROPERTY TAX TIME!

City Center will be open for in-person payments Monday through Thursday 8:00am-4:30pm and Friday 8:00am – 12:00pm. The office will be closed for the Holidays on December 25th, December 26th, and January 1st.

Reminder: Friday, December 29th City Center closes at 12:00pm.

How can I pay?

Mail in or drop off payments to City Center. Check, money order, or credit card (fee associated) payments are accepted. The drop box is located inside the East entrance of City Center.

When are my taxes due?

Payments in full or first installments are due by Wednesday, January 31, 2024. Second installments are due to the Calumet County Treasurer, 206 Court Street, Chilton by July 31, 2024.

ANIMAL LICENSING

All pets that are 5 months or older on January 1, 2024, are required to be licensed annually in the City of Brillion. Bring proof of rabies vaccination to City Center to register. The cost is \$3.00 for spay/neutered and \$8.00 for unaltered pets before April 1, 2024. After April 1st, a \$5.00 per let late fee is assessed.

Reminder: These can be paid at the same time as property taxes are paid.

KENNEL LICENSING

A kennel license is required for residents that have more than two dogs or three cats. The licensing period is January 1, 2024 through December 31, 2024. The initial fee is \$25.00. The renewal fee is \$10.00. Kennel licensing is subject to site evaluation by a police officer and/or building inspector prior to the issuance of the license. Failure to obtain a kennel license shall be punishable by a fine.

GOLF CARTS/ATV/UTV LICENSING

The permit is required annually. The fee is \$25.00. A vehicle inspection by the Brillion Police Department is required for the initial application. A sticker will be issued for this purpose and shall be plainly displayed on the exterior of the vehicle.

Reminder: These can be paid at the same time that property taxes are paid.

Snow Removal

Per City Code, any person failing to remove either snow or ice from the sidewalk within 24 hours after a snowfall or sleet storm shall be subject to a forfeiture. The city shall clear the sidewalk of snow or ice at the expense of the property owner as a special tax assessment against their property. The expense of snow and ice removal shall be a charge of \$120.00 per hour plus administrative fees with a minimum charge of one hour. DO NOT blow or shovel snow back into or across the street. If your property is in the Downtown District please do not pile snow on the sidewalk terrace. Please keep your sidewalks and sidewalk ramps clear of ice and snow. Residents living near a fire hydrant are asked to remove snow from around the fire hydrants. Please refrain from parking on city streets when the snowplows are in operation.

Yard Maintenance

The height of all grass and weeds shall not exceed 12 inches. Property owners are NOT to blow grass clippings onto city streets.

Brush Pickup

Each year the city will pick up all brush, branches and limbs that have been placed on the curbside the 1st Monday of each month starting in May and ending the 1st Monday of October. If the first Monday falls on a holiday, the pickup will occur on Tuesday. Branches and limbs must be no longer than six (6) feet in length and no more than six (6) inches in diameter, which are placed on the curbside in small piles.

Compost Site

Accepted: leaves, grass clippings, other vegetation, brush, as well as limbs and branches under three inches in diameter.

Not Accepted: stumps, root balls, garbage, appliances, recyclables, construction materials (wood, fiberglass, bricks, cinder blocks, etc.) and tires.

2024 - Household Hazardous Waste Events (Appointment Required)

Appointments are required for these events. Registration for the events will open after January 1, 2024. Appointment registration and additional event information such as acceptable items, event locations, etc. can be found on the website, www.calumetrecycles.com or by calling 920-849-1442. The hazardous waste events are FREE for all Calumet County residents disposing of household hazardous waste.
