# Police & Ligonier Borough play vital role in keeping Fort Days Running



Fort Ligonier Days couldn't happen without the immense help and cooperation of the Ligonier Valley Police Department. Chief Michael Matrunics, who has been involved with the event since he first became a local officer in December 1993, recently explained the role the department plays in keeping the three-day festival safe and enjoyable.

"A lot of it involves traffic control," he says. This includes setting up detours, placing and installing signs including no parking signs, keeping routes open for emergency vehicles, and placing barricades where needed.

Officers also place signs related to Ligonier Borough's Fort Ligonier Days ordinance – signs reminding everyone that pets and backpacks are

prohibited in the festival area, along with open containers of alcohol in public places throughout the borough.

"We start Wednesday setting up with help from the borough's Public Works Department.," noted Sgt. James Friscarella.

The Committee added, "Ron Ross and his borough crew are an integral part of the planning, implementation, and clean up of the event. Come Monday morning, it looks like Fort Days never even happened!"

The crews work together pre-staging barricades for the state-approved detour route. That detour takes traffic off the Diamond area, utilizing Loyalhanna, St. Clair and Church Streets to North Market (PA 711). "For us it doesn't start Friday – it starts in August with planning and scheduling. Officers start on Wednesday before Fort Days with assigned activities." Sgt. Friscarella added.

Controlling traffic is one of their bigger tasks when the festival begins. For that, LVPD gets help from the Indiana Fire Police Association.

Team 211, a Westmoreland County volunteer assistance team based in Latrobe, also helps with traffic control and the PA State Police are also involved, mainly keeping traffic flowing and pedestrians safe at the US 30-PA 711 intersection near Fort Ligonier.

# Fort Ligonier Days 5K Run/Walk is Big Sunday Feature



Organizers of the Fort Ligonier Days 5K Run/Walk are hoping for another big turnout on Sunday, October 13, when the run starts off at 8:30am with the firing of a muzzle-loader by a Fort Ligonier re-enactor. Walkers will start a couple minutes after the runners leave.

"We're looking for this to be a fun event with a focus on family participation and getting younger people to participate," says first-year chairman Jack Butler. "We also encourage more walkers to take part."

The race starts and ends at Ligonier Valley High School, 40 Springer Road, with the course utilizing East and West Main Streets, turning near the intersection of East Main and U.S. 30 and traversing the historic Ligonier Diamond once in each direction. The event takes place rain or shine.

For youngsters 10 and under, there will be a Cannonball Dash at the high school at 9:30 AM, with all children taking part receiving a gift. Carole Paterson is organizing the Cannonball Dash.

At the start/finish line, there will be plenty of refreshments, and baskets featuring some terrific gifts will be raffled.

The 5K Walk/Run has been a part of Fort Ligonier Days since 2004, and initially used the back roads north of town. In more recent years, organizers moved the route to Main Street, where more spectators could enjoy the action. The event attracts runners and walkers of all ages – from young school kids to senior citizens.

Registration can be accomplished on-line by visiting https://runsignup.com/Race/PA/Ligonier/FortLigonierDays. Those not registered can do so Sunday morning before the race, from 7 to 8 AM. There is a \$30 entry fee for runners and walkers, \$10 for the Cannonball Run.

In addition to the chairman, the 5K committee includes Karen Markle, co-chair, along with Jen Sausman, Pam Anderson, Pete Pacienza and Kim Wallace.

The committee would like to recognize the creator of the new 5K logo, Clara Wallace. She is a current Freshman at Savannah College of Art and Design(SCAD). Her major is Fine Arts. She is also a member of the Cross-Country team at SCAD. Clara was excited to combine her gift of art and love of running to design the Fort Ligonier 5K t-shirt design. She has enjoyed running the Fort Ligonier 5K many times.

Following the race, medals will be presented to the top three male and female runners and walkers overall, plus the top three males and females in each age group: 10 and under, 11-15, 16-19, 20-29, 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-65, and 66-plus.

Organizers urge participants to stay after the race and enjoy the food vendors, craft booths and live entertainment at the festival, and visit Fort Ligonier.



# Looking for a Sign? Stop at Acorn Metal Art!

Jim and Nancy Valley are well-known in the Ligonier area for their attractive and distinctive carved wooden signs, found at many businesses and storefronts throughout the area. They founded Acorn Signworks shortly after settling in the Ligonier Valley in 2001.

In more recent years, they've also become equally well-known known for their beautiful metal signs, fashioned from 1/8th inch aircraft grade aluminum. Nancy says it started with her "love of words and quotes, combined with Jim's technical expertise." Acorn Metal Art got its start in 2016 and has since been a regular feature at Fort Ligonier Days and Ligonier Country Market.

Nancy's favorite quotes are mostly inspired by nature and writers such as John Muir and Rachel Carson, along with song lyrics with a positive message. She refuses to make signs with a negative message, or anything of a surly or political nature. Aside from quotations, she also makes address signs, house numbers, traditional pineapple welcome signs, Christmas signs – just about anything you can imagine.

Her ideas first get translated to design software, which then transitions to another program, which creates toolpaths. Those toolpaths are uploaded to a computer that directs the router how to precisely cut each sign. The signs are then sanded and the faces are ground to create a surface that catches the light. The finished product is almost indestructible and should last a lifetime. The signs won't corrode and can be displayed inside or outdoors.

Glass cleaner can be used to clean them up if they get dusty.

"We used to do many shows around Pennsylvania and West Virginia," says Nancy, "but we've narrowed it down quite a bit. Fort Ligonier Days is our best show and it's home!"

Acorn Metal Works signs can also be found at Main Exhibit Gallery in Ligonier and Artisans of Hands and Heart in downtown Greensburg.

Jim is still busy with his sign business. He specializes in carved and gilded signs – such as the one that went up recently at Redcoat Cigar Co. on West Main Street in Ligonier. He also made the impressive sign for Fort Ligonier at the corner of US 30 and South Market Street – among many throughout town. The Valleys are grateful to the local community and non-profits for their support of Acorn Signworks through the years.

Nancy is also a school bus driver, transporting students from Johnstown to Valley School of Ligonier. She has volunteered on the Fort Ligonier Days Committee as transportation and parking chair since 2015.

Acorn Metal Art's booth can be found during Fort Ligonier Days in the Municipal Lot at the corner of North Market and West Church Streets – across from the YMCA sign that Jim crafted.





Heather Kaecher, Food Committee Chair, is thrilled about the amazing food vendors this year at Fort Ligonier Days 2024.





# Wine & Spirits Lot expanding, reorganizing

Wine and spirits have a long history in Pennsylvania, going back to the earliest Colonial times. Like most Colonial Americans, our Founding Fathers were fond of adult beverages, consuming copious amounts of beer, cider, whiskey and Portuguese Madeira while drafting the Declaration of Independence in Philadelphia.

George Washington famously distilled whiskey at Mount Vernon. Meantime, Thomas Jefferson was trying – and failing – to cultivate grapes for wine-making at Monticello, although he had a fondness for French wine.

During the French and Indian War at Fort Ligonier, rations for the British troops included seven gills (about 28 fluid ounces) of rum weekly. And don't forget the Whiskey Rebellion got started in Western Pennsylvania, leading to an armed insurrection in 1794 – protesting the first tax levied by the federal government under the new Constitution.

You might want to keep such history in mind when you visit the growing Wine and Spirits Lot near Holy Trinity Church off West Main Street during Fort Ligonier Days. Co-chairs Karen Markle and Jen Sausman report a new emphasis this year. "We're striving to choose more local vendors, " they explained. "We have almost all our vendors returning from last year, but the lot is being expanded to include new vendors."

"Also, there will be a new layout, so vendors are mixed together rather than segregating the wineries and distilleries, to offer a more eclectic experience for visitors." There will also be an "enhanced traffic flow" for folks to walk through the lot, ensuring that they don't miss a single vendor. And look for an expanded lot featuring








hot food vendors just across West Main Street at the Train Station lots.


Red Barn Winery from Delmont, Oak Brook Winery of Scottdale and Benigna's Creek Winery of Klingerstown, PA, are among the new vendors this year, along with McLaughlin Distillery of Sewickley Hills, and Wigle Whiskey of Pittsburgh.

There are 17 returning vendors, from as close as Ligonier, Scottdale and Mount Pleasant and as far as State College, Lewistown and Mifflintown. See the complete lineup elsewhere in the program.

So feel free to enjoy the "spirit" of Fort Ligonier Days and visit the exciting, expanded lineup of 22 Pennsylvania wine and spirits vendors anytime during festival hours. And remember that Benjamin Franklin once declared wine to be "a constant proof that God loves us, and loves to see us happy!"



The **Modelaires** was a dance band that performed from the 1940s through 2010s. In 2022, the grandson of a founding member is bringing it back!

My earliest memory of hearing The Modelaires was when I was about four years old. I was listening to my grandfather, Mike "Ug" Cilli, sing a song at a church festival in Jeannette, PA. I was so moved that I started to cry. This was probably also my first ever experience with live music. Throughout the next twenty years, I would continue to see The Modelaires as often as I could.

Since that first show, Ug introduced me to many different types of music. I remember listening to Louis Armstrong, Louis Prima, the Mills Brothers, and other artists from that era in his car on our drives back and forth from school. It was a special treat when he would pop in a cassette of newly recorded music from The Modelaires.

I wish that I paid more attention to the stories he told me about the early days of the band during those car rides. But, in truth, he was a very humble person and probably left out a lot of the details about the accolades he and his band received.

What I gathered from the stories that he told me was that he helped to form the band in the early 1940s but took a short break when members enlisted during World War II. The Modelaires performed throughout western Pennsylvania and beyond in their heyday. They disbanded shortly after my grandfather passed away.

I found out more from others who were there. Like how he fixed an upright bass just in time for a show after it was seemingly irreparably damaged en route to a gig. Or about the story of when The Modelaires were playing in a lounge next to the theater where the Harry James Orchestra was playing one night. Harry James, the famous trumpet player, stopped in to hear The Modelaires after his show and was so impressed with my grandfather's

playing that he asked Ug to replace one of his trumpet players on their tour. My grandfather apparently had a few such offers over the years, but he never took them instead opting not to travel in order to raise a family.

Ug and I are similar in many ways. We have similar facial features – there are some people who have actually thought that it's me in the pictures of The Modelaires from the 1950s. Likewise, we have a love of similar styles of music. We both also emerged as unlikely band leaders. Though unassuming, my grandfather was often called the "Captain" of the original Modelaires by his bandmates and I led Neon Swing X-perience for 24 years when no one else wanted the role.

But, we are also different in many ways. Ug knew a lot about cars and I don't. Similarly, he was a handyman that could fix anything while I am not good with things like that. He also was a little more reserved onstage than I am, though to be fair I never saw him perform in his youth. I've never served in the military and he enlisted in the Navy. But, most related to this band, he was a damn good trumpet player and vocalist – way better than I am.

I am not putting my name in front of The Modelaires because of ego. Rather, the opposite. I don't expect us to replicate what my grandfather and his band did. We are unable to. So, instead, we are reforming under the name "Mike Urick and The Modelaires" to differentiate ourselves from the original group while creating a bridge to their style.

I was mulling over the idea of restarting The Modelaires for years when I finally got motivated to do it. Around the same time that I made this decision, one of the musicians who played with my grandfather passed on The Modelaires box of music to me, sorted and organized just as neatly as I would have expected from my grandpap. When I opened it, I was shocked to see all of the different styles that were included in The Modelaires show. From traditional jazz, to Italian favorites, to polkas, to classic country, to modern rock: they did it all with their trademark style. I recently started playing the trumpets that my grandfather used onstage, and it feels as though these instruments should once again perform songs from The Modelaires repertoire.

I've collected an ensemble of musicians that can build on The Modelaires' passion for music and evolve it to resonate with today's listeners. We're not going to play everything note-for-note the way the original Modelaires did, but we are going to pay homage to their legacy. I hope that this tribute would make my grandfather proud.



# Opened 70 Years Ago!

Reconstructed Fort Ligonier first opened to the public in 1954. General John Forbes and his army built the original fortification in 1758 on their way to capture Fort Duquesne (today's Pittsburgh). While the fort was attacked three times including the October 12, 1758, attack on Fort Ligonier, which inspired the formation of Fort Ligonier Days, the enemy never won!

For decades, community residents have helped protect and preserve this 18th century landmark

that changed world history. Great care and planning have taken place over the years to achieve historical accuracy and authenticity of the reconstructed fort.

By the turn of 20th century, the ruins of Fort Ligonier were long gone, and only memories of the log bastion remained. But those lingering memories inspired John Jacob Hughes to purchase a parcel of land in 1927 where part of Fort Ligonier had originally been located.

Hughes presented the property deed to the William Kenly Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution which, in 1931, purchased an adjoining lot. In 1934, the DAR erected a monument, now located in front of the museum, to commemorate the site of Fort Ligonier. Houses and structures on Loyalhanna Street surrounded the two preserved lots and covered much of the original fort grounds. In 1946, the newly formed Fort Ligonier Memorial Foundation (now the Fort Ligonier Association), began to see how additional property could be acquired and historical research conducted to reconstruct Fort Ligonier. The effort to rebuild the fort could not have been accomplished without the community's support.

Architect Charles M. Stotz led the first phase of Fort Ligonier's reconstruction from 1949-54 and 1964-69. The first sections of the reconstructed fort opened to the public in 1954.

From 1960-65, local pharmacist and archaeologist Jacob Grimm directed the largest archaeological project of Fort Ligonier yet completed. His dedicated efforts uncovered thousands of incredible artifacts found preserved by an old stream bed discovered near the Fort. Today, Fort Ligonier's Museum displays many of the artifacts found by Grimm along with a fascinating French and Indian War Collection.

Reconstruction efforts expanded in the mid-1990s when additional original fort property



became available, and Brad Mooney with Heritage Restorations added the fascine battery, outer retrenchments, officer's houses, and structures in the lower historic area. Another important part of reconstructing Fort Ligonier and sharing the stories of the British army community - that at one point numbered more than 5,000 people, was recreating the artillery train and wagons that you see on the fort grounds today. During the Fort Ligonier Days weekend, (Saturday and Sunday) the loud booms of cannon fire will be heard echoing throughout Ligonier as cannons from the artillery train are used for historical demonstrations to commemorate the October 12, 1758 attack on Fort Ligonier.

It's the central event of Fort Ligonier Days — a Western Pennsylvania autumn ritual that both spectators and participants have looked forward to for over half a century.


## It's BIG!

Spontaneous applause, laughter and cheers ripple through the throng at the sight of a familiar band or marching unit. Family and class reunions, some planned, some "of the moment," unfold on the lawns and porches along Main Street as the parade goes by.

If you love marching bands you can look forward to the high energy performance of the Indiana University of Pennsylvania band — now in its second century of representing IUP. You'll also see some of the biggest and most storied

high school bands from Western Pennsylvania and beyond, such as the Butler High School Golden Tornadoes; the fabled "Mohigans" of Morgantown High School, in West Virginia; the Franklin Regional High School Panthers, and popular units from Westmoreland and adjoining counties. A large band from Trinity Christian School, in North Versailles, will be making its first appearance in the parade, and units like the massed drummers of the Pittsburgh Steeline and the pipers of the Pittsburgh Firefighters Memorial band will add to the excitement.

Bill has since been actively engaged in portraying Dr. Franklin. His striking resemblance to Dr. Franklin has enhanced his performances, and he remains committed to mastering and sharing the extensive details of this eminent American figure's life.

In addition to school and historical society visits, Bill has made presentations at the National Constitution Center, Independence Hall (for the National Park Service), Christ Church, Carpenter's Hall in Philadelphia, and the University of Pennsylvania. He is an active Freemason and serves as Chaplain in his Lodge.

Every July 4th, he joins Thomas Jefferson and John Adams in a poignant reading of the Declaration of Independence at the National Archives in Washington, D.C. Prior to this engagement, he regularly participated in the National Independence Day Parade in our Nation's capital city. Bill has also contributed to several PBS channel film projects and continues to travel nationwide to enlighten the public about the life and contributions of this key American personage
