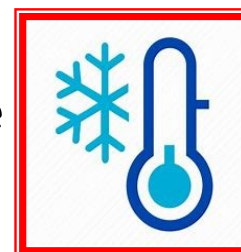

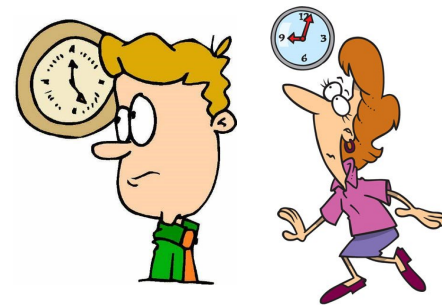

LET'S MEET A NEAL CENTER VOLUNTEER

The volunteers with the Neal Center often say that the center has been a major help to them as they adjust to retirement. One of our volunteers that declares this to be very true is Carole Champion. Carole has been a volunteer with the Neal Center since 2015, giving her time to working the Reception Desk. She has also assisted with the Health Fair, the annual car show, and worked in the center's cafeteria as a beverage server.



Born in Polkville, NC, Carole was raised by her grandparents, who farmed for a living. There were also three aunts that lived with them, so Carole had plenty of family to care for her. She recalled her growing up years as being fun. She especially enjoyed horse-riding. "I had an uncle who had a horse named "Nell" that I would ride with my two cousins. We all rode and fortunately never fell off!", she said with a laugh. She and her cousins also rode bicycles together. Carole was always well-behaved as a youngster, though she recalled an incident that taught her a valuable lesson. "My Dad was visiting us. My cousins and I rode our bicycles together one day and there was a tiny country store on the dirt road we rode on", she recalled. "We decided that we wanted to have some ice cream, though none of us had any money. We asked the shop owner to simply charge it to my father or to my cousin's father, which he agreed to do." They had their ice cream break, then resumed riding their bicycles. Upon their return home later that day, Carole's father inquired, "What did you do today?". She explained that they rode bicycles and got ice cream. Her father then asked, "Who paid for it?". Carole knew she had to be honest about it, so she admitted requesting that the debt be charged. "He wasn't happy with us", she stated while laughing. "We didn't get in serious trouble, but we got a good scolding. We knew not to ever do that again", she concluded.

Carole also recalled her school years. "I liked school. We had good teachers back then", she also added. Carole admits that though she was a good student, she didn't concentrate as hard on her school work as she would now. She recalls taking Home Economics at Polkville High School, which was a favorite subject for her. "I learned how to sew in Home Ec class. It was one of my best subjects", she adds. When asked if there was a school subject that she either disliked or wasn't especially good at, she stated, "No, not really. I never failed anything, but I wasn't a straight-A student, either." She graduated from Polkville High School in 1956, along with 29 other graduating seniors. Even today, Carole continues to have contact with some of her graduating class.

Once she graduated from high school, she decided to become a cosmetologist. She enrolled at Shelby Beauty School to focus on how to be a hairdresser. She took her classes while she worked at Hudson Hosiery. Her coursework taught her the basics of working with hair, including shampooing, perms, colorings, highlighting, and more. She chose not to get her certification in cosmetology, though she seriously regretted her choice later in life. "I would have had to go to Raleigh to get my licensure as a cosmetologist, but at that time, I decided not to do that", she said. In the meantime, when Carole married Ben Champion in 1960, the newly-married couple moved to Shelby. He began a long career with Fiber Industries (later renamed Hoechst-Celanese) while she became the mother of two daughters, Gina and Donna. It was when he was about to retire from Celanese that Ben approached Carole with an offer: to have the chance to finally get her certification in cosmetology.

Carole looked into what would be required for her to become certified, and was shocked at what she discovered: she would have to repeat all of the same coursework she had taken previously to graduate in cosmetology. "Ben asked me if I wanted to take all of the cosmetology coursework again", she said. She agreed to do it, except this time, she had to take her coursework in Raleigh, since the Shelby Beauty School had closed. "I told my husband that I didn't know if I could pass it at my age. He assured me that if I flunked, he wouldn't fuss. But, it was the Good Lord's help that got me through it". Attending the "Progressive School of Cosmetology", she successfully repeated the entire program while working and raising a family, receiving her certification as a cosmetologist. This would become her profession for the next 29 years.

Carole was still working when she first came to the Neal Center, which was then located in downtown Shelby. "I was in the line dancing class while I was still working", she remembers. She decided that after her cosmetology career, she was ready to retire. When her husband Ben passed away in 2010, Carole realized that being retired was now different from what she had planned, as she now was needing things to fill her time. This was when she became a volunteer for the center. The brand-new senior center was now at its current location and Carole became a Reception Desk volunteer, which she continues to do today. "At first, there was more to learn than I cared about learning!", referring to learning how to operate an electronic switchboard when she began volunteering. What are her thoughts about the Neal Center? "It's such a good thing for people to go to when they need to get out. It serves a purpose. It's something people can come to that's most beneficial".

In addition to volunteering, Carole has a lot to keep her on the go. She's now has four grandchildren and ten great-grandchildren. She is the owner of a "party poodle" (a black and white mix) named "Mia". You won't catch Carole at home very often, either! She goes out often, attending dances and going out to eat with friends. She also is a member of Pleasant City Church and plays the piano on alternate Sundays for her Sunday School class. She sums up how she feels about her life: "I've been blessed with good health. I've done a lot in my 85 years and there's nothing really that I am excited about still wanting to do. I try to stay healthy and enjoy life".

FUN FACT: Carole cuts and styles her own hair! "I only go to a hairstylist one or two times a year", she says. Carole is often amazed over how people comment on how great her hair looks. "I've been cutting my own hair for years", she stated. She concluded with, "I can even mess my hair up, if I want to!"

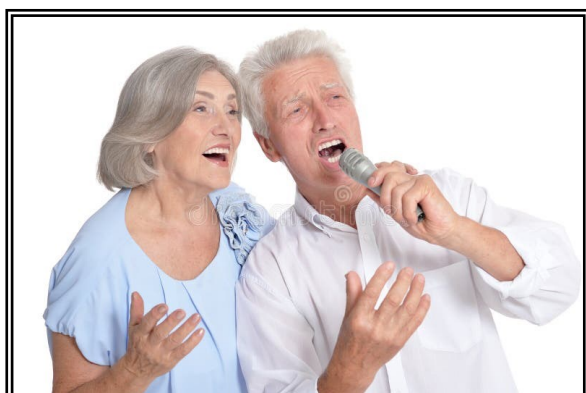
