

# Park progress pleasing in Penn Forest

July's Penn Forest Township supervisors' meeting was quick and quiet – a good start for the summer. Only a dozen citizens joined supervisors on July 11, with the meeting shifted a week due to the holiday.

To start, there were speak-

ers about the proposed windmills and about the plans submitted for monitoring towers in 2013. Concerns were shared about noise, fires in the windmill units and fire safety, ice, helicopters used for maintenance, and more. Concerns were also about how the hall at Penn Forest Township Fire Co. #1 is too small for all the people who want to attend the hearing – the location of the meeting is a Zoning Hearing Board decision.

The Zoning Hearing Board meeting about the proposed Bethlehem Water Authority windmills project (Atlantic Winds) was continued – with the next session to be at the Penn Forest Twp. Volunteer Fire Co. hall on August 25 – starting at 6 p.m.

Newest supervisor Roger Meckes was added to the authorized signature list for township accounts. Meckes will also attend this month's meeting of the Park & Recreation Committee. It was agreed to alternate supervisors through those meetings in the future.

Work on the township park is going along just fine and is

set to be completed on time (weather permitting). Supervisors will also meet with Pocono Fence about a fencing in the park when the grading is done. There was discussion about a possible grant being available for the township to put up a building at the park. Plans for the building exist already.

Roadmaster and supervisors chairman Butch Reiner reported that the line painting of township roads is nearly done. Tar and chip and paving will be completed in July. The roads crew is doing brush trimming to cut back growth away from roads, and cleanup of litter where time permits (the crew is down to two).

In code officer Kathryn Forry's report, she issued 19 zoning, 7 building (3 new homes) and 5 septics permits, as well as 8 zoning certificates of occupancy plus 6 for buildings. Inspections were 25 for zoning, 50 UCC and 57 septic inspections. Two special exception applications were heard, and granted approval. Her office also attended the Atlantic Wind special exception hearings about the windmill farm on June 23 and July 14.

Garbage permits from the 2015-16 year totaled \$237,489. The new permits season started in July, already collecting \$133,320. The Transfer Station collected \$1,393 in June for bulk items.

There's \$2,754,610 in the general fund and \$1,021,740 in the PLGIT fund. The total of all monies on deposit is \$7,308,896.

from the general fund. \$13,705 was payment #1 to the State Workers Insurance. Other bills of note are \$921, \$3,984, and \$5,335 to Barry Isett & Assoc. (BIA) for engineering \$4,170 for June and \$3,946 for May to Nanovic Law Offices, \$2,835 and \$2,549 to US Treasury for payroll taxes, EIT commission to Berkheimer of \$2,358, \$2,005 to Capital One for the charge card (bought two flagpoles), \$1,796 to Carbon County for 911 services,

\$1,702 for staff's health and vision insurance to Highmark, Rapa Law Office was paid \$1,633, \$865 for three months of Millennium Computer services, \$476 to WEX Bank for vehicle fuel, plus 23 smaller bills.

BIA also earned \$3,607 for SEO inspection work from the septic fund, and there was a \$8,890 refund from the septic escrow fund to Glenn Keller. The Times News was paid \$1,123 for advertising the paving bids, and Five Star Equipment did \$1,114 worth of maintenance to the John Deere backhoe – from the Liquid Fuels/roads fund.

From Sanitation, payroll was \$9,250 in May and 11,208 in June, \$11,159 was paid to Waste Management for garbage hauling, \$1,702 to Highmark for health and vision, \$373 to PPL, \$468 to Solomon Container, and \$300 was spent for six other small bills.

Custom Contracting was paid \$105,930 for payment #2 of their park work, \$1,747 was paid to the township general fund for two flagpoles, and \$343 in smaller bills.

Supervisors approved a \$50 donation for the Albrightsville Fire Co. horse show and a \$45 ad in the program book for the Carbon County Townships annual meeting.

It cost \$210 to shred 27 boxes of old township records. Office staff will be sent for Quickbooks training at \$79 each, plus mileage.

There were 17 right to know requests submitted – and 19 responded to, as well as 24 zoning & septic information requests – all responded to.

Supervisors okayed a joining of two Bear Creek Lake lots for Mason, a change to the Indian Mountain Lakes boundary line, and an approval to the Goldman lot line submission for their property on Meadowrock Dr.

There were 16 right-to-know requests last month, with 19 completed. There were also 25 zoning and septic info requests taken care of.

Two press members and five staff joined supervisors Reiner, Meckes, Chris Fazio, Scott Lignore, and Judy Knappenberger at this meeting.

The next regular meeting of Penn Forest supervisors is Monday, August 1 at 6 p.m. for the work session, with the regular meeting to follow at 7 p.m. at the township building on Route 903.

# **Broadening business in Kidder**

Carbon County Chamber of Commerce and Economic Development Corporation representatives detailed doors open to broadening business in Kidder Township at the July 21 supervisors' meeting. Chamber Executive Director Marlyn Kissner joined Carbon County Director of Economic Development Kathy Henderson explaining initiatives geared toward educating entrepreneurs and connecting employers with employees as a means of strengthening the overall economic growth in the county.

Kissner said a partnership with the Greater Lehigh Valley Chamber "brings strength" further creating business opportunities with enhanced networking and marketing efforts.

Henderson, shown at right, reported a need in the area for jobs in technical professions including welding, electrical and engineering fields, while creating innovative ideas for future planning such as transportation highways and bridges.

Supervisor Thomas LaFond asked about the township's eligibility to join the organiza-



tion. Kissner said many participate.

"[Perhaps there are] different avenues within the Chamber a township would benefit from," he suggested.

"The Chamber is something for everyone but something different to everyone," she stated regarding a question about Homeowners Association participation.

Calling Kidder a "borderline township in Carbon County," supervisor Barbara Franzosa concluded "This crew has done so much to bring events up here to us."

### New regional hospitality skills training program debuts

The Pocono Counties Workforce Development Board, Luzerne/Schuylkill Workforce Development Board, Northampton Community College, and Luzerne County Community College have been awarded a Pennsylvania Department of Labor & Industry grant to offer the Bridge to Employment in the Hospitality Industry Program (START) to residents in Carbon. Monroe. Pike, Wayne, Luzerne, and Schuylkill Counties.

Northampton Community College and Luzerne County Community College will provide the Skills, Tasks, and Results Training program, which provides students with the opportunity to earn a total of five industry recognized credentials. The 300 hour program is designed to provide:

• 200 hours of instruction covering all aspects of hotel operations.

• Development of skills necessary to enter four distinct career pathways - front desk representative, guestroom attendant, maintenance employee, and restaurant server.

• 45 hours of academic support.

• 55 hours of field experience at a hotel, resort or restaurant.

Gregg Marzano, an adjunct faculty member at Northampton Community College with

25 years of hospitality experience, has been hired as program coordinator and will oversee the day-to-day operations of the program and coordinate the field experience with participating resorts and restaurants in Pike, Wayne, Monroe, and Luzerne Counties.

The program is expected to serve 120 participants with a goal of providing a pathway to employment in the hospitality industry and/or the background needed to enroll in a credit-bearing hospitality program at Northampton Community College, Luzerne Community College, or East Stroudsburg University. Classes are at the Monroe Campus of NCC in Tannersville and on site at the Pike/ Wayne Workforce Alliance. ### Heffley, House leaders announce **Opioid Task Force recommendations**

In a bipartisan effort to address Pennsylvania's devastating opioid crisis, Rep. Doyle Heffley recently announced the completion of the recommendations from the House Resolution 659 Task Force and Advisory Committee on **Opioid Prescription Drug Pro**liferation by the Joint State Government Commission.

Gov. Tom Wolf, Speaker Mike Turzai (R-Allegheny), Majority Leader Dave Reed (R-Indiana), Rep. Harry Readshaw (D-Allegheny) and Rep. Stephen Kinsey (D-Philadelphia) joined Heffley and more than 100 House members to call for continued work on the opioid issue in Pennsylvania.

Opioids are a class of drugs derived from or pharmacologically similar to opiates. These analgesics carry a significant risk of addiction. Some data suggest that 60 percent of prescription opioid deaths occur in patients with no history of substance abuse and who are only prescribed an opioid by one health care prac-

The recommendations include five pieces of legislation passed by the House:

House Bill 1737 (John Ma-

her, R-Allegheny)—Provides for the proper disposal of unused prescriptions. The measure passed the House unanimously May 16, 2016.

House Resolution 590 (Stephen Kinsey, D-Philadelphia)-Directs the Department of Drug and Alcohol Programs to establish and administer a task force on access to addiction treatment through health plans.The measure passed the House unanimously May 16, 2016.

Brown, R-Monroe/Pike)— Sets a seven-day limit on the prescription of opioids in emergency departments. The measure passed the House on June 23, 2016.

House Bill 1805 (Kurt Masser, R-Northumberland/Columbia/Montour) – Requires prescribers and dispensers to undergo continuing education in pain management, addiction and prescribing practices. The measure passed the House on June 23, 2016.

"Opioid abuse is the No. 1 health crisis in our state. It is taking the lives of far too many Pennsylvanians, and my colleagues and I are determined to find solutions to this complicated issue. We passed five bills based on the recommendations from the Opioid Prescription Drug Proliferation Task Force and these are substantial first steps toward curbing opioid abuse in our Commonwealth," said Heffley. "This crisis is far from over and there is much work to be done. But I am encouraged by our progress and the spirit of bipartisanship surrounding this issue."

Speaker of the House Mike Turzai and House Majority Leader Dave Reed encouraged Gov. Tom Wolf to call a special session of the General Assembly to continue the bipartisan effort to proactively and effectively combat the opioid crisis.

"Opioid overdoses and deaths cut across all age groups, economic sectors and racial demographics," said Turzai. "This isn't a partisan issue, as we have been fighting it for years in the House, and we are respectfully requesting the governor call a special session so we can best protect our children, w families and communities." " Under Article IV, Section 12 b of the Pennsylvania Constitution, the governor can con-

vene the General Assembly "on extraordinary occasions" by proclamation. Its members can only consider legislation on those subjects designated in the governor's proclamation.

"Extraordinary circumstances require extraordinary response and the opioid crisis in the Commonwealth is such an occasion," said Reed. "A special session will allow us laser focus in putting measures in place to defeat the problem."
