This was the seventy-second anniversary of the National Day of Prayer (NDP), and the fourth consecutive year when pastors from different Christian Churches in Greene and Putnam Counties gathered to pray together at Lakepoint Community Church.

Prior to the beginning of the prayers, Christina Davis blew the Shofar signaling the call to prayer. The Shofar, is an ancient musical instrument made from a ram's horn, and is mentioned in the Bible seventy-two times from Exodus to Revelations and is used for many purposes including prayer.
