

Pastor's Notes - Why?

- 1) Why come and worship God? The Bible says that God commanded us to worship God in order to remember and give thanks for the great things that God has done for us through Christ Jesus. When we don't worship God, God says we don't remember what God's done for us, and therefore we're not inclined to be thankful. How can we be thankful for something that we're not even aware of or that we don't even think about? Whether we're in Muskegon with Calley, or Houston with Cassidy, or Tennessee with Mom, or Yellowstone National Park on vacation, we find a place to gather with other believers and remember the great things that God's done for us in Christ. God says that a thankful heart is an immeasurably happy heart. See you in worship!
- 2) Why get involved in a Bible Study group? The Bible says that God's Word is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path. Without giving intentional attention to God's Basic Instructions Before Leaving Earth (Bible), we're walking and living in the dark so that, like John Candy and Steve Martin in "Planes, Trains, and Automobiles", we're going the wrong way (but tragically can't even see it because we're spiritually in the dark). See you at one of our many Bible Studies!
- 3) Why tithe? Why give a starting point of ten percent of my income to God's work of saving souls through the church's Gods-given work of lifting up and spreading the Good News of Jesus Christ? The Bible says that God established the tithe as a promise for enjoying peace from God. In the first Bible book, Genesis, Abraham gives a tithe of all he has to Melchizedek. Melchizedek is not a Levite priest; Levites don't even exist yet. Melchizedek is a Christophany, which means Christ appearance. Melchizedek serves as the King of Righteousness and the Priest of Salem, (Salem means peace). Ten is the Biblical number of power. Abraham gives ten percent of all that has just now come to him; every paycheck, every inheritance, every windfall, every 51 cents that he found at the Circle K gas station parking lot, all that has just now come to him in anyway, Abraham gives ten percent to Melchizedek to say, "You, Melchizedek, You, King of Righteousness, Priest of Peace, You, (not this money, not this material stuff, not this earthly wealth), You, Melchizedek are my power, my peace, and my righteousness. And I give the first ten percent to you as a testimony to who you are in my life: you're my God, Help, Strength, Savior, Lord, Provider of Daily Bread, Securer of My Future and my loved ones' future. I give this ten percent to you as an investment in Your Kingdom."

By God's grace, I myself and my family have given a starting point of ten percent of every cent of money that has come our way since I was 15 years old, which was when I first read the Bible straight through and saw the numerous explicit references to tithing in both the Old Testament and the New Testament. My family and I have never gone without any basic need, even when I only had 11 cents to my name when I was 45 years old. Even then, we tithed...and tangibly tasted what God promises, namely, that God established the tithe as a promise for enjoying peace from God in Christ, the King of Peace, who alone is able to give true and lasting peace. Money can't give it, no amount of money can give that peace that passes all understanding. Only the one to whom Melchizedek and we tithe can give it...Behold, God in Jesus Christ!

Trust and follow Jesus. He gives you power, love, and self-control.

We will be closed on Wednesday June 19th. Our two -year-olds thru four -year-olds will have VBS with Mrs. Susan June 25th - 27th



ATTACK ON U.S. CHURCHES

Examples of attacks on churches in 2023 include:

Vandals breaking into Greater Tabernacle Worship Center in Winston-Salem and causing \$ 15,000.00 worth of damage.

An individual/individuals spray painting on a monument to unborn children at St. Rosalia Church in Pittsburgh, P.A.

Looters spray painting "abortion is our human right" on the property at Second Baptist Church in Palermo, Maine.

Some of the attacks involved progressive-leaning churches such as the tearing down of Pride flags by vandals on church properties.

Arielle Del Turco, director of the Center for Religious Liberty at FRC and author of the report, said the motivations for many of the acts may be unknown, but the "effect is unmistakable religious intimidation."

"They send the message that churches are not wanted in the community or respected in general," Del Turco said. "Our culture is demonstrating a growing disdain for Christianity and Christian beliefs, and acts of hostility against churches could be a manifestation of that. Regardless of the motivation of these crimes, everyone should treat churches and all houses of worship with respect and affirm the importance of religious freedom for all Americans."
