### For younger kids


Draw a picture of your favorite Bible story and mail it to a friend.

Use one of your favorite ways of communication to send out an invitation to join you at your church for worship or another event. Paul would have loved to be able to reach so many people so quickly!




# Paul and the Philippians

# Paul's Postcards


Paul wrote letters to his friends to tell them that they could trust God wherever they were! Draw pictures in these three postcards of places you know you can trust God.
