Corruption is evident as Joseph's brothers, driven by jealousy and hatred, plot against him. They resent Joseph. Their envy escalates to a corrupt act: they sell Joseph into slavery and deceive by making it appear that he was killed. This moment marks the beginning of Joseph's trials, initiated by the moral corruption within his family. Years later we see the theme of redemption. Instead of seeking revenge, Joseph forgives them, acknowledging that, although their actions were intended to harm him, God used their betrayal for a greater good—to preserve lives. Joseph's act of forgiveness and grace not only brings healing to his family but also illustrates the redemptive power of God, who can transform human wrongdoing into a source of blessing.

Welcome Guests. Sometimes it is said, "I wish I could get closer to God." A wondrous truth is that God cannot come closer to us than He does in the Lord's Supper. God the Son is present here with His true body and blood with the gift of forgiveness. With the closeness of this gift, the Bible also speaks to a closeness in doctrine and confession of faith.
